FR BARTO WRITES: With Ash Wednesday, the Church begins the holy season of Lent, forty days of grace in which we prepare our hearts for the celebration of the Passion, Death, and Resurrection of our Lord Jesus Christ. This is a sacred time marked by repentance and conversion. As the ashes are placed upon our foreheads, we hear the call: "Repent and believe in the Gospel," and we are reminded, "Remember that you are dust, and to dust you shall return." These words invite us to humility, to recognise the fragility of life, and to turn back to God with sincere hearts.

The ashes, a symbol of penance since ancient times, remind us of our need for God's mercy. They invite us to look within, to acknowledge our sins, and to desire true change. Lent is not just another season of the year; it is a spiritual journey. It is the starting point of deeper reflection, a time to step away from routine and rediscover what truly matters.

The Church proposes three essential practices to guide us: prayer, fasting, and almsgiving. Prayer is our living relationship with God, a daily dialogue that shapes our hearts. Fasting teaches us self-control and detachment, making space for God. Almsgiving opens us to others in charity and compassion. Through these practices, may this Lent be a time of renewal, reconciliation, and transformation for us all.
